Destination to Historic Sites and Diverse Canadian Cultures

In the early 1870's Fort Macleod was a North West Mounted Police outpost, and the main trading center for Southern Alberta.

While staying at the DJ Motel take a tour of the historical buildings on Main Street, and also visit the Fort Museum for the history of the North West Mounted Police. Enjoy live performance or a movie at the Historic Empress Theatre on Main Street. The Macleod Livery and the Oldman River Valley Wilderness Park are within walking distance of the DJ Motel.

LETHBRIDGE AND CALGARY

Take Highway #3 East to Lethbridge to shop at the malls, dine at the fine restaurants on Mayor Magrath or visit the Nikka Yuko Japanese Gardens and the Galt Museum.

In July, visit Calgary 1½ hours north from Fort Macleod to experience the World Famous Calgary Stampede. Banff and Lake Louise are about 3 hours away from Calgary. The Royal Tyrrell Museum of Paleontology is 1 hour east of Calgary in Drumheller.



HEAD-SMASHED-IN BUFFALO JUMP

Head-Smashed-In a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site located 18km north & west of Fort Macleod is one of the world's oldest, largest and best preserved buffalo jump's known to exist. Head-Smashed-In Buffalo Jump bears witness to a custom practiced by native people of the North American plains for nearly 6000 years.



REMINGTON CARRIAGE MUSEUM

The Remington Carriage Museum in Cardston is 40 minutes south of Fort Macleod. The museum houses the largest collection of horse-drawn vehicles in North America, with over 250 carriages, wagons and sleighs.

CROWSNEST PASS

Take a drive through the Crownsnest Pass on Highway #3 West and view the scenic Rocky Mountains. Visit the Frank Slide Interpretive Centre which displays information on the 1903 Frank Slide (rockslide-avalanche). The Crownsnest Pass will also take you to various other places in British Columbia.

WATERTON NATIONAL PARK

An hour south of Fort Macleod is the Waterton Lakes National Park a UNESCO World Heritage Site, which borders the Glacier National Park in Montana.
